**TOUR DESCRIPTIONS**

**FREDERICKSBURG/NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE PACIFIC WAR**  
**THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2016**

Enjoy a scenic ride to Fredericksburg to tour the National Museum of the Pacific War which is dedicated to everyone who served in the Pacific under Admiral Nimitz. The Museum includes over 34,000 square feet of indoor exhibit space including the George Bush Gallery, Admiral Nimitz Museum, Plaza of Presidents, Veterans' Walk of Honor, Japanese Garden of Peace, Pacific Combat Zone, and the Nimitz Education and Research Center. A 43,000 square foot expansion was added in 2010, where you can explore the impressive display of Allied and Japanese aircraft, tanks, guns and other artifacts made famous during the Pacific War campaigns. Enjoy lunch (on your own) at one of several restaurants located on Fredericksburg's downtown Main Street. There is shopping nearby on Main Street for those interested.

**UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE/SAN ANTONIO MISSIONS TOUR**  
**THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2016**

On our tour today begins with Mission San Jose, established in 1720 and considered the "Queen" of all the missions. It is still an active Catholic church today and famous for the Rose or Rosa's window, a stone carved window. You'll have time to tour the mission and see the film, introducing you to mission life. Our next stop is Mission Concepción, the last of the five missions built in 1731 and the oldest unrestored mission of all the Spanish missions. Both Missions are a part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site.

**AFTER HOURS TOUR OF THE ALAMO  
THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2016**

We will walk across the street to visit The Alamo, the cradle of Texas Liberty. Established in 1718 as San Antonio de Valero (Alamo), it's first of the five missions established here by the Spanish government and the site of the famous battle of 1836 where 189 men gave their lives for the freedom of Texas. You will receive a tour by one of the expert Alamo history interpreters. The Alamo is a State Memorial and Shrine. They request no pictures, no drinks, no hats.

**SAN ANTONIO CITY TOUR  
FRIDAY, OCTOBER 28, 2016**

From the earliest Spanish Missionaries in 1691 to today's traveler, San Antonio's appeal continues to draw attention. Relax and enjoy a fully narrated tour of San Antonio's unique blend of rich heritage, traditions and natural beauty. Points of interest include a stop at San Fernando Cathedral, the original church of the Canary Island settlers, and a tour of Main Plaza. From there you'll have more sightseeing with a stops in the King William District, the first historically designated district in the state of Texas, and the Japanese Sunken Garden. You will drive by and enjoy the beautiful architecture of the Witte Museum, the San Antonio Museum of Art (in the original site of the Lone Star Brewery), the Veteran's Plaza, the new Tobin Center for the Performing Arts and more as time permits.

**HISTORICAL FORT SAM HOUSTON TOUR  
FRIDAY, OCTOBER 28, 2016**

U. S. military presence began in 1845 in San Antonio when Texas became a state. In 1876, it moved to what was called Government Hill and began building the historical Quadrangle. In 1890 it was designated Fort Sam Houston after a Texas historical figure. Fort Sam Houston constitutes the largest collection of historic buildings in the Department of Defense (800+) which form the Fort Sam Houston National Historic Landmark. The post is the birthplace of military aviation and evolved into the "Home of Army Medicine" after World War II and into the "Home of Military Medicine" with the establishment of the Medical Education and Training Campus in 2010. You will visit the historic Quadrangle and the newly refurbished Fort Sam Houston museum. After a drive through post, you will receive a tour of the state of the art "Center for the Intrepid" which is part of the largest military medical facility in the world.
